# **MESSAGE FOR THE 5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER, YEAR A, 2020**

Dear Parishioners of Holy Family Church

This Sunday's Gospel text (Jn 14:1-12) points out that we must trust Jesus our Risen Lord for He is the Way, the Truth and the Life. Indeed, our leaders and authorities need lots of guidance and wisdom from God as they are poised to prepare the exit strategies from the 'Circuit Breaker Measures' not withstanding unforeseen circumstances.

It is interesting to note that Jn 14 is right after the Washing of Feet and the Last Supper (Jn 13). The apostles were shocked and confused when they experienced these actions as these had never happened before. It was in these settings that Jesus tells them to 'Trust in God still and trust in me' (Jn 14:1b).

It was the eve of His own Passover but we find Him taking the trouble to take away fears from his friends' troubled hearts. Just hours before His own arrest, humiliation, torture, unjust trial and execution, He Himself trust in the power and love of the Father who keeps on calling each one of us 'out of darkness into his wonderful light' (2<sup>nd</sup> Reading; 1Pt 2:9).

Not only has He revealed Himself as the Way to the Father, He wants to accompany us to the Father for it only through Him, our Gate that we enter our Father's house which has many rooms specially prepared for us. No worries about overcrowding and issues about safe-distancing.

He has poured out on us the Spirit of Truth which we can follow with full trust and confidence. In the 1<sup>st</sup> Reading, the early Church saw the need for a special group of Church Ministers, the Deacons, and the Holy Spirit provided the Church much needed wisdom to inaugurate this Ministry. These days, we need the outpouring of the Holy Spirit to impart charisms and gifts to us so as to help us figure out fresh directions and newness of purpose as we strive to outrun the COVID-19 virus.

We, the living stones of House of God must remain anchored firmly on the Corner Stone for He passes to us the key to unlock Life-giving support as we put on standby plans to re-connect with those who are lost and re-kindle relationships and friendship with those we have not seen for quite a while. Also, just as we have drawn sustenance from our own respective mothers while we were still in their wombs, let us remember them in our prayers on the occasion of Mothers' Day this weekend.

## SPECIAL DAY OF PRAYER AND FASTING

Pope Francis has endorsed the call to "the believers of all the religions to unite together spiritually on 14 May 2020 in a day of prayer and fasting, to implore God to help humanity overcome the coronavirus pandemic."

He also encouraged international cooperation to respond to the crisis, and emphasized the importance that scientific efforts to find a vaccine be put together in "a transparent and disinterested way" and that "the essential technologies be made universally available" so that every infected person may be able to receive the medical care needed.

The appeal calls on believers in God worldwide to hold "a day for fasting, prayers, and supplications" on 14 May 2020.

He focused on these two issues when he addressed a virtual global audience by Vatican Media from the library of the Vatican's Apostolic Palace at midday on Sunday, 3 May 2020.

In his address, he repeated the call for an interreligious day of prayer saying, "Remember, 14 May, all believers together, believers of the different [religious] traditions, to pray, to fast, and to do works of charity."

The proposal for this worldwide day of prayer came originally from the High Committee for Human Fraternity, which was established in September 2019 as a concrete response to the Document on Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together signed by Pope Francis and Sheikh Ahmed el-Tayeb, Grand Imam of Al-Azhar, during the pope's visit to the United Arab Emirates in February 2019.

As the pope endorsed that call today he explained that "since prayer is a universal value, I accepted its proposal [for this day of prayer]."
